Note:

According to the Law 107 dated September, 11 2020 Article 7.210; "All person who begins any industry, business or service that is subject to a license payment has the obligation to notify it to the corresponding municipal Director of Finance, no later than 30 days after the beginning of the activity... "The person that doesn't notify as required in this section, unless such omission is due to a reasonable cause, and isn't an involuntary omission will be incurring in a transgression of law that could be penalized with \$500 or up to 6 months jail time or both at the discretion of the Tribunal, not regarding any other penalties that can apply under other sections of the law"
